



Speaker Series Brian Spaly:

An Entrepreneur's Journey

Brian Spaly has always been an unusual guy. The current chairman of Tecovas is a serial entrepreneur with a rare blend of talents, a charming personality, and a self-deprecating sense of humor.

Raised in Ann Arbor, Michigan, Spaly studied business for his undergraduate degree at Princeton University. After college, he trekked across Asia for a year, an experience that he described as transformative. After Asia, he moved to California to pursue an MBA at Stanford University. As a grad student, he taught himself to sew his own clothes, then designed a better fitting pair of men's pants and sold them from the trunk of his car. This turned into his first company, Bonobos, a

clothing manufacturer that grew at an exponential rate until being acquired by Walmart after only five years. He and his co-founder had a falling out prior to the sale, but the story of Bonobos is still used as a case study by the Stanford MBA program. After briefly moping around after leaving Bonobos, Spaly developed Trunk Club, an online clothing merchandiser, in Chicago just to have something to do. Trunk Club was an even more successful venture, selling to Nordstrom's for \$350 million after only four and a half years in 2014.

Only in his mid-30s by this time, Spaly started investing in startups and assisting with initial public offerings. His travels and investing brought him to Texas, where he clicked with the founder of a small boot company named Tecovas. He eventually joined the board of directors and ultimately became the executive chairman. During this time, he got married, had children, and moved his primary residence to Austin. He has continued his entrepreneurial streak by continuing to invest and advise energetic young companies from his position as a general partner at Brand Foundry, a venture capital firm.


You may not know his name, but you've *definitely* seen his work.

Michael O'Brien is a photographer whose keen eye and decades-long career have produced some of the most celebrated and recognizable photos published in magazines and books, as well as displayed at the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery in Washington, D.C., and the Wittliff Collections at Texas State University.

His portraits and documentary photographs have a distinctive style with a dose of humanity that's earned him awards. His images have been featured for years in *Texas Monthly*, *Life* and *National Geographic* magazines.

Although O'Brien is a Tennessee native, he arrived in Texas after stints in Miami and New York. He's been in awe of the state ever since.



"It's wonderful for a photographer because it's so visually rich," O'Brien said.

Headliners members got a rare treat and a peek into the stories behind many of these famous photos as O'Brien joined with Evan Smith for a photo presentation that included many of the photographs published in Texas Monthly when Smith was editor in chief.

The evening was touted as "The Story Behind the Photo." And it didn't disappoint as the duo talked about these photos that have captured subjects from small-town folks in rural Texas to celebrities and presidents.

"These ordinary people probably are my favorite subjects -- rather than celebrities," O'Brien said.

Smith added that because the state is growing more urban and the rural population is on the decline, O'Brien's work is "really a link to our heritage and our past that is fading as we go."

Among the famous faces he's captured on film are George W. Bush, Lady Bird Johnson, Willie Nelson, Earl Campbell, Ben Crenshaw, Beyoncé, Billy Gibbons, Larry McMurtry, Harvey Penick, Bud Shrake, Sissy Spacek, George Strait and Kelly Willis.

Speaker Series Dr. Michael Belfort

From Capetown to Austin: The Journey of a Fetal Surgeon

As members gathered in the Nash Room for Dr. Michael Belfort's presentation, the first slide was on display and noted the following credentials: MBBCH, PhD, MD, MidCOG (SA), DA(SA), FRCOG, FRCS(C), FACOG. His lovely wife, Joanne, laughingly referred to it as his "alphabet." She added that they came to Austin from Houston on their plane, for which Dr. Belfort is certified. He is also a certified helicopter pilot. After all this information the term that came to mind (and Dr. Belfort acknowledged) was quintessential overachiever.

Belfort started his talk with his early history and journey to Master of Surgery in OB/GYN. He grew up in Durban, South Africa, and during 1969-1975 attended a high school where "you got beaten if you made a mistake." (This, perhaps, was a clue to the development of his amazing accomplishments.) He received his MBBCH (the U.S. equivalent of an M.D.) at the University of Witwatersrand. In 1983, he was conscripted into South Africa's Special Forces for two years, where he learned parachuting and flying. Immediately after the military, he took OB/GYN training at Groote Shurr Hospital, University of Capetown, where Dr. Christian Barnard performed the first heart transplant. During this time, he met his future wife, a pediatrician.

Belfort wanted to stay in Capetown, which he described as a stunningly beautiful city, but in 1989, he was offered a residency and fellowship at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. He stayed there until he moved on to the University of Utah in 1997. In 2010, he decided to return to Baylor, because he had some very ambitious goals:

- Build the leading OB/GYN department in the U.S.
- Build a fetal center, leading in innovation.
- Develop a Global Women's Health Program.

These goals obviously impressed Baylor College of Medicine and Belfort is now the chair of the OB/Gyn department at the college and OB/GYN-in-chief at Houston's Texas Children's Hospital. In March 2010, the Pavilion for Women opened, reinforcing Belfort's belief in the importance of combining children's and women's health care. He proudly announced that the Pavilion will soon have 10 ICU beds, making it the largest women's ICU in the world.

Belfort then led attendees into a jaw-dropping saga of the things that he has addressed in his tenure at Baylor. The first was a description of spina bifida, a condition where the lower spinal column in the fetus grows outside the skin and occurs in about 1 in every 3,000 births. This condition usually results in the patient losing the use of their legs and other serious conditions. Trying to fix spina bifida in utero was previously so unsuccessful that it was banned for 20 years.

In 2014 Belfort went to Barcelona to learn a new technique, and he has now performed more than 180 fetoscopic spina bifida procedures at Texas Children's. He played a news video of a successful surgery – and then introduced the parents (who were in the room) of the patient, who is now 2 ½ years old and "running everywhere" taking delight in being a miracle baby.

Another condition receiving Belfort's attention was hypoplastic left heart syndrome. He told the story of baby Grace, whose in utero surgery involved laser treatment and the insertion of a stent. During the procedure her heart started failing, but Belfort did not give up, administering cardiac compression and multiple injections for 45 minutes. Now age 10, Grace is another success story.

Belfort addressed his Global Women's Health Program. In Malawi there is the first residency program in the country, with six trainees. The program now claims the lowest infant/women's mortality rate in the country, a rate lower than in Texas.

To add closure to the "Capetown to Austin" title of his talk, he announced, "Now in Austin!" This referred to the opening of the new Texas Children's Hospital in north Austin. It, too, offers women's services, and Belfort proudly revealed that he delivered the first baby there. While many people are involved in enterprises such as TCH, it is obvious that Dr. Michael Belfort is a major force in expanding women's and children's health care.

The back of his business card has the phrase "Giving Life to Possible," on it. That brings to mind another apt phrase – quintessential hero.






Construction Timeline

Frequently Asked Questions

1. It's summer in Austin. What exactly is the dress code at the Club?

- Business attire is required. Slacks or nice jeans with collared shirts for men. Jackets and ties are not required. Similarly appropriate attire for women. No shorts or athletic attire are permitted for men or women.
