Speaker Series: Justin Nelson

May 6, 2024

Special Events Committee co-chair Ken Herman introduced Justin Nelson for a discussion about modern-day litigation. Nelson's clients are a newsworthy mix who have sought the Austin attorney's skills in high-stakes litigation. A partner in the Houston-based firm Susman Godfrey and former law clerk to the late United States Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, Nelson ran as a Democratic candidate for Texas attorney general, being narrowly defeated by the incumbent Republican Ken Paxton.

Nelson shared insights about his cases that have spotlighted the media, defamation, misinformation, and the challenges posed by the rise of artificial intelligence. "It really is part of the same story about the rise of misinformation, what truth means, and how we're consuming information," Nelson said of his work. Cases included representation of Michael Cohen, former President Donald Trump's lawyer, in a defamation case; a class action against OpenAI and tech companies claiming they misused the work of nonfiction authors to train artificial intelligence models; and representing Dominion Voting Systems securing a multimillion-dollar settlement with Fox News over the network's promotion of misinformation about the 2020 election.

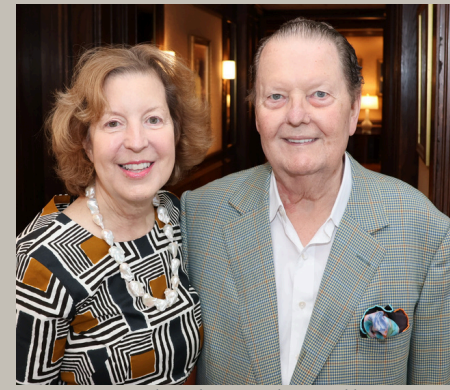

Speaker Series: General James E. Rainey & James Milliken May 23, 2024

How Universities Contribute to Transforming the U.S. Army

What do UT and the U.S. Army have in common?

An intriguing question, and one that members were privy to on Thursday, May 23. Tim Taylor introduced the trio who would help answer that question: Lawrence Wright, moderator; General James Rainey, commander of the U.S. Army Futures Command (AFC); and UT System Chancellor James Milliken. Taylor started the conversation by saying that UT and the AFC were great partners since the Command arrived in Austin in August 2018, after tough competition from about 150 other cities. Taylor turned the program over to Wright, who stated, “We’re going to talk about futures.” He recounted a seminal moment in 1957, when his music teacher played the sound of Sputnik for the class. He called it a paradigm shift and knew at that moment that “nothing would ever be the same.” Fast forwarding to the present, he realized that the internet, technology, and the AFC were “going to transform the future in Austin.” Wright asked Rainey how the AFC would change everything.

The general replied that although AFC headquarters were here in Austin, there are 25,000-29,000 thousand personnel in 22 countries, some of whom are civilians and combat personnel. The AFC is dedicated to maintaining “really deep technical expertise” and is the “nexus between technology and national security.”

Lawrence followed with the question: “Why Austin?” Gen. Rainey responded that the “nexus” he referred to was about education and research, something that our highly rated, renowned university possesses in abundance. He also said that he has found Austin to be a patriotic place that cares about people who have served in the military.

Tongue-in-cheek, Lawrence commented that he thought the AFC would be a “bunch of hackers.” The general acknowledged that data-centric warfare was important, and that China was a legitimate threat in the competition for “whoever figures things out first.” Wright followed that with a comment that by 2040 there would be bases on the moon, manned by robots. The general quickly iterated that “machines will never replace people,” citing the fact that they have no conscience, and “don’t do art.” Wright, hopefully facetiously, responded, “Siri, destroy humanity.” Laughter erupted when Lawrence’s phone answered him, asking for clarification. Chancellor Milliken couldn’t resist adding, “What about, ‘Siri, destroy Texas A&M.’” More laughter, showing that very serious topics need comic relief at times.

Wright then asked the chancellor how the AFC interfaces with UT. He related how UT staff and AFC staff meet on the 19th floor fitness room in the UT System building at seventh and Lavaca streets. Milliken laughingly said that the Army fitness routine was an inspiration to UT staff. He then went on to say that there was a big emphasis on robotics and drones, and that UT's superior robotics programs would be able to save lives. Being a major center of intellectual activities gives the AFC a distinct advantage in the future of warfare. Also important to understand is that universities have really been the reason for advances in the military. Wright summarized this by saying that a small percentage of the population serves in the military, and many of those are away from urban areas, so Austin's partnership between UT and the AFC is a "good thing."

Questions from the audience were many but focused on, first, whether the Ukraine situation has changed things. Rainey classified this as "the single most disruption to warfare." He said that the AFC is wrestling with how to become more adaptive, and that "we're going to have to change our business plan without losing our value system." Another question addressed drone warfare and whether the military is doing anything to control this. The general answered that the AFC is taking it very seriously, especially since "China is really going after replacing us" as the major world power. He added that "space is alarming. We're behind in space."

A sobering question about what the AFC is doing to protect us from nuclear threats was met with the response, "That's not our mission," but the military is working hard at modernizing systems to reduce the threat. The general did say that China won't drop bombs but will attack cyber-wise.

AI, of course, came out as a major topic, and the general had an interesting response. He did not address the "dangers" of AI but replied that there was no better use of AI than in the medical field. UTSA has a double degree in medicine and AI, and, while robotic combat surgery is not here yet, this new technology is a major focus. At the conclusion of the evening, there was enthusiastic applause for an extremely enlightening discussion. Rainey, however, had a most appropriate last word. Citing the upcoming Memorial Day holiday, he provided one thought: "Remember."

Verne Lundquist Sports Media Institute in Action



With support from the Headliners Foundation, attendance soars at UT's 2024 Verne Lundquist Sports Journalism Camp!

On Friday, July 12, the UT Center for Sports Communication & Media welcomed 44 high school journalism students from five states to the 2024 Verne Lundquist Sports Journalism Camp. Now in its third year, the three-day camp has grown in both size and scope with significant financial support from the Verne Lundquist Sports Media Institute, a program of the Headliners Foundation. Since the first group of 25 campers attended in 2022, the program now hosts nearly twice as many students from high schools in Texas, California, Minnesota, Mississippi and Kentucky.

The Foundation sponsored the camp with a \$20,000 grant, which helps cover the cost of student participation and program expenses. The contribution was funded by the Foundation's "Evening with Verne Lundquist" event, which raises money to support programs of the Verne Lundquist Sports Media Institute. Guest speakers at the annual fundraiser have included Headliners Club member and veteran sports broadcaster Verne Lundquist, CBS Sports' James Brown, legendary Dallas Cowboys Quarterback Roger Staubach, and golf broadcasters Gary McCord and David Feherty, both former professional golfers.

"We're excited that the Lundquist initiative is helping attract promising young people into journalism," said Mark Morrison, chair of the Foundation's Lundquist Institute. "It's possible because of an amazing commitment by Verne and Nancy Lundquist and our great partnership with UT's Moody College of Communication," he said. "Our impact expands each year, and we will keep building on that success."

The camp provides a unique, hands-on opportunity for young journalists who are interested in pursuing a career in sports journalism. Highlights include a mock press conference with UT coaches and athletes, tours of the football and basketball facilities, and presentations by industry professionals. Campers produce their own broadcast projects and enjoy a true college experience for the weekend.

"Our camp continues to grow and flourish, thanks to the faith and financial support of the Headliners Foundation and our vital partnership with Texas Athletics," said Kevin Robbins, camp director and professor of practice at UT's School of Journalism and Media. "High school students from around the country now know about our camp," said Robbins. "They choose us because we expose them to outstanding professionals in sports media and truly once-in-a-lifetime experiences," he said.

The outstanding professionals Robbins refers to are industry leaders, sports writers and broadcasters, authors, educators and multimedia journalists. This year's impressive line-up of speakers included Headliners Foundation Board member and *Austin American-Statesman* sportswriter Cedric Golden, *New York Times* best-selling author and senior staff writer for *The Ringer* Mirin Fader, assistant director for social media and creative content for Texas Athletics Avery Faulkner, senior editor at KUT Syeda Hasan, 247Sports/Horns247 Texas' beat writer/reporter Eric Henry, and professor of practice and artist-in-residence at Michigan State University Mike Castellucci.

Many thanks to Robbins; David Ryfe, director of the UT School of Journalism and Media; and the faculty and staff at the UT Center for Sports Communication & Media for hosting the camp and providing an outstanding experience for the next generation of sports journalists.

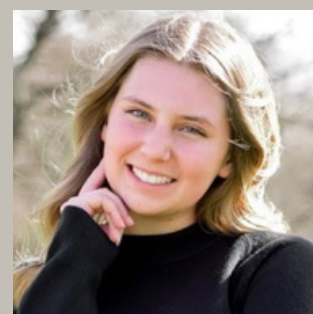

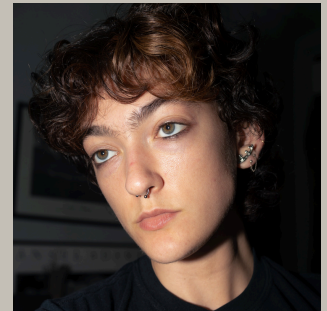

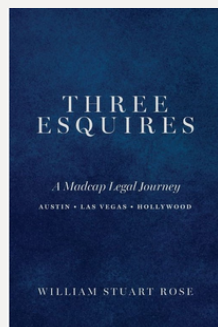
